



1 substantial bodily harm cases:

2 (1) All DUI's (misdemeanor or felony)<sup>1</sup>

3 (2) Vehicular Homicide<sup>2</sup>;

4 (3) Homicide by Vessel<sup>3</sup>;

5 (4) Reckless Driving Causing Death or Substantial Bodily Harm<sup>4</sup>;

6 (5) Leaving the Scene/Duty to Stop at Scene of Accident Involving Death or Substantial  
7 Bodily Harm<sup>5</sup>; and

8 (6) Vehicular Manslaughter<sup>6</sup>.

9  
10 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that a case wherein a defendant was arrested for or  
11 charged with a DUI or vehicular crime resulting in death or substantial bodily harm, as  
12 delineated in this Order, and the DUI or vehicular crime charge is dismissed or denied for  
13 prosecution, may be randomly retracked to a department assigned a criminal docket should other  
14 criminal charges remain pending. If the remaining charges include crimes of domestic violence,  
15 the case should be randomly assigned to a department assigned domestic violence cases.

16  
17 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that if a case is initially assigned to a department  
18 assigned a criminal docket and a charge of DUI or vehicular crime resulting in death, as  
19 delineated in this Order, is added to the Criminal Complaint, the case will be reassigned to the  
20 department assigned the DUI/Vehicular Crime docket.
